Dear Sir:

In reply to your telegram, I am enclosing
check for £100 on account of work being done by
Mr. Starkie Gardner.

Could you send me a sketch of the gates as
they will appear when finished, and do you think they
would look well on the north of the house? If they would,
should we have three gates, a center pair and one gate on
each side to drive in and out, keeping the center gates
closed to lock down the vista? The side gates would
always be left opened. Perhaps part of the present iron
railing could be made in the form of gates.

If we use the gates and metal fence in front
of the house, should they be placed about twenty-four feet
further north, making the court yard in front of the house
twenty-four feet wider?

I would be very glad to know your ideas
about these matters, and hope to hear from you soon.
